Preached Retreats

The Journey of Holy Week April 5-12, 2020

This retreat will help us accompany Jesus during this time of passion, death and resurrection. The focus is not on the violence done to Jesus, but on intimacy with him in their midst. This time will help us deal with our own diminishment and losses by seeing Jesus dealing with his.



Father Bob Dufford, SJ, is an internationally known musician (St. Louis Jesuits) and composer of liturgical music. He is best known for his work in composing liturgical music (*Sing to the Mountains, All the Ends of*

the Earth, Like a Shepherd, Love One Another, Be Not Afraid, Behold the Lamb of God, etc.) He lives at the Creighton University Retreat Center in Griswold, Iowa. He provides spiritual direction for clergy in the Des Moines Diocese. He spent 14 years at the Jesuit Retreat House in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and has preached many retreats and parish missions.

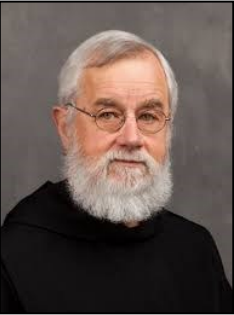
Over the last seven years he has been composing instrumental music patterned on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to help people’s prayer lives. The collection, comprising 34 pieces totaling over three hours of orchestral music, will soon be published by O.C.P. probably under the title *Tongues As of Fire.*

The Parables of Jesus, Paradigm for Religious Life—June 19-26, 2020

This retreat will focus on the primary way Jesus chose to teach: *the parable.* What is a parable and how it works will be explored. A number of the parables Jesus used in teaching will be examined. Christian life by nature should be “parabolic.” Religious life should also be “parabolic.” Father Hensell’s retreat will develop our understanding of what the parables mean and how they can enrich our lives.



Father Eugene Hensell, OSB is associate professor of Scripture at St. Meinrad School of Theology where he has taught scripture on the undergraduate and graduate levels for 40 years.

Father was ordained a priest in 1969.

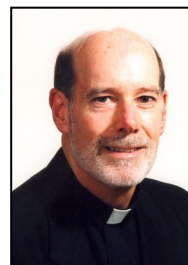
