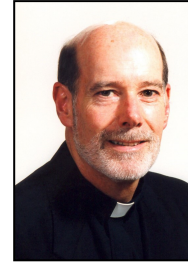

Retreat Directors for 2019

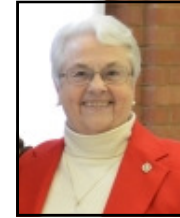
Directed Retreats
